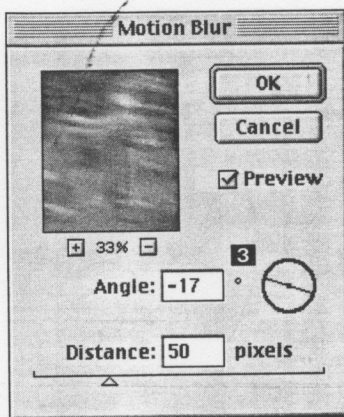
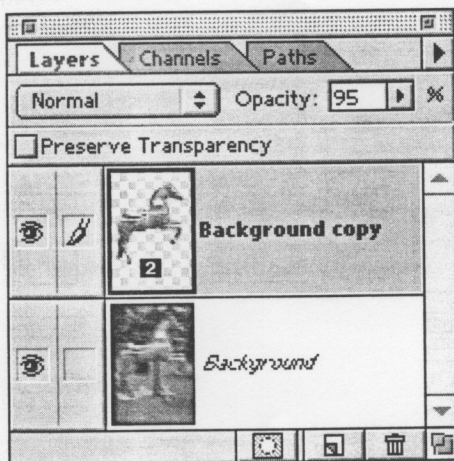

1 Select an object.



To create an illusion of motion, you will select an object that you want to remain stationary, copy it to a new layer, and then apply the Motion Blur filter to the original background.

To motion blur part of an image:

1. Select the imagery that you want to remain stationary **1**.
2. Choose Select menu > Feather (Ctrl-Alt-D / ⌘-Option-D).
3. Enter 5 in the Feather Radius field, then click OK (Enter/Return).
4. Ctrl-J / ⌘-J to copy the selection to a new layer **2**.
5. Activate the original layer that contains the background imagery.
6. Choose Filter menu > Blur > Motion Blur.
7. Choose an Angle between -360 and 360 **3**. (We entered -17 for our image.)
and
Choose a Distance (1-999) for the amount of blur. (We entered 50 for our image.)
and
Click OK (Enter/Return) **4**.
